SECTION 1: DISPLAYS

Orchids in Classes 1 to 4 are eligible for judging in other classes where appropriate, provided they are accessible to judge and have been nominated, if this is required.

CLASS 1 — Display 9 sq metres

To consist of a display of orchids and foliage plants (see Condition 6). Area 9 sq metres.

All entries in this class will receive \$300 for exhibiting

Class 1a non-commercial | Class 1b commercial

CLASS 2 — Display of 4 sq metres

To consist of a display of orchids and foliage plants (see Condition 6). Area 4 sq metres.

All entries in this class will receive \$150 for exhibiting

Class 2a non-commercial | Class 2b commercial

CLASS 3 — Table Top Display of Orchids

1.5 (approx) metres x table width to be embellished with foliage plants to enhance the display (see Condition

6). All entries in this class will receive \$50 for exhibiting

SECTION 2: EXOTIC HYBRIDS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. All entries are free and open to Members of the O.S.N.S.W. and any Affiliated Orchid Society.
- 2. Entries are received upon the basis that the Society or its Sponsors shall not be responsible for any loss, destruction nor damage to such exhibits and the exhibitor shall have no claim against the Society or Sponsors.
- 3. Entries are accepted on condition that they are disease free. The decision of the Show Marshal, or his appointed representative, shall be final.
- 4. All competitive entries shall have been owned and in the possession of the exhibitor for the preceding six months. This rule does not apply to ferns or foliage plants used in displays.
- 5. All competitive entries should be correctly and clearly labelled with the name of the plant.
- 6. Exhibitors may use Ferns and/or Foliage plants to embellish exhibits. No flower other than Orchids, Carnivorous Plants or Anthurium may be used in any display.
- 7. Nominations for classes marked # must be in the hands of the Show Marshal by 5.00pm on Thursday 16 May 2024. **Please note**: Judges have the discretion to award plants that are not nominated.
- 8. Any terrestrial that needs a cover for humidity, it must be see through.
- 9. All plants shall be in position ready for judging by 6.00pm on Thursday 16 May 2024.
- 10. A display representative needs to be available on the morning of Friday 17 May to identify the class winners and place getters in their respective displays. A list will be supplied with the winning orchids. The owner of each respective orchid needs to be printed on this form by the representative and returned to the Show Marshal this same morning.
- 11. If in the opinion of the judges no exhibit in any class warrants a prize, none will be made. At the discretion of the Show Marshal additional classes may be included where warranted.
- 12. Judging shall be by a panel of Judges nominated by O.S.N.S.W. Registrar and shall be in accordance with the standards and by-laws laid down by the O.S.N.S.W. Inc. **The judges decision will be final**.
- 13. No exhibit may be dismantled or removed prior to the closing time of the show which is 2.00 pm on Sunday 19 May 2024.
- 14. Championship ribbons will be presented to the winners at 1.30 pm on Sunday 19 May 2024. All other class prizes will be handed out in a pack to a representative of each society.
- 15. NOVICE shall mean: Any exhibitor until she/he has won in aggregate first prize three genera or classes at any Orchid show or shows. The winning of a yearly point score in a monthly competition of any Society in any Genus/Class shall be deemed equivalent to a first prize in a Genus/Class. An exhibitor shall remain a Novice until the end of the calendar year in which the first prize for the third Genus/Class was won. Novice plants are eligible for any Championship Prizes.
- 16. 'SEEDLING' shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowered for the first time. For exhibition purposes seedlings shall retain their status of 'Seedling' throughout the flowering season in which they first flower. Mericlones and species are not 'seedlings'.
- 17. 'MINIATURE SPECIES' are defined as Orchids with flowers 15mm or under in size across the widest part of the flower, regardless of the number of flowers, and distance of < 200mm from 1st to last flower. All 'Miniature' species are to be judged in the Miniature species class.
- 18. Nomenclature of orchids, the classes are based on the current RHS classification of orchids. Awards will be granted in accordance with the current RHS nomenclature. Note Doritis and Doritaenopsis are now recognised as Phalaenopsis. Dendrobium includes all the genera that have been sunk back into Dendrobium.
- 19. Staking shall be in accordance with the rules of O.S.N.S.W. and be in such a manner so as not to be obtrusive and distract from the overall beauty and charm of the plant.
 - a. Flowers shall not be tied or supported on any part of the flower including the ovaries.
 - b. Inflorescences shall not be tied or supported above the lowest flower.
 - c. In the case of branching racemes shall not be tied or supported above the uppermost branch.
 - d. Where plants are tied above the bottom flower or top branch, the judges are permitted to penalise, or temporarily remove such tie for the purpose of judging.
 - e. Ties should be able to be easily removed by the judges. Cable ties and sticky tape are not acceptable.
 - f. Points will be deducted for obtrusive staking, dangerous staking where the stake protrudes above the flowers and could poke some ones eye out and large or ornamental clips that detract from the floral display.
- 20. When displays are being judged for arrangement and display, recognition will be given to displays which are uncluttered and spaced to best advantage. As a guide approximately 25% of the floor area should be open to allow access to the judges. Also displays should be dressed all around so as to present an aesthetic appearance.
- 21. The Show Marshal, or his appointed representative, has the right to remove any plant from any display or vendors area for any reason what so ever.
