DISPLAY CLASSES AND APPEARANCE MONEY

Class 1 – Floor Wall/Island display of approx. 9 sqm (approx. 3m x 3m) (Class 1 available to Societies only)	\$400
Class 2 – Floor Wall/Island display of approx. 6 sqm (approx. 2.5m x 2.5m or 3m x 2m)	\$300
Class 3 – Floor Wall/Island Display of approx. 4 sqm (approx. 2m x 2m) or Table Top of 3 tables	\$200
Class 4 – Floor Wall/Island Display of approx. 1-3 sqm or Table Top of 2 tables	\$100
Class 5 – Table Top of 1 table	\$75
Class 6 – Group of 4 Orchids	\$30

All displays will be judged using the following criteria:

Design, Appearance & Presentation Visual impact of plants without crowding, allowing access to plants for judging. Placement of prominent plants and pleasing arrangement of colours	35 pts
Genera 1 point per genus up to 5 points	5 pts
Quality of Orchids Overall quality of plants including freshness of flowers	20 pts
Variety of Colour Orchids only to be considered	15 pts
Finishing Pots and equipment should not be visible	15 pts
Ticketing Style – Tickets should be unobtrusive and legible. Names – Should have correct nomenclature	5 pts 5 pts

Display Judging – Key Features of a Display (*OSNSW Judging Manual*)

Plants shall be arranged so as to create a visual impact. Colour, variety, balance and proportion combine to give overall harmony to the display. Ideally each of the colour groups - e.g. red, white, yellow etc - shall be within the display. Balance and proportion shall be achieved by distributing plants, sizes and colour throughout the display.

The placement of large groups of the same size or colour plants would naturally cause an imbalance. Outstanding plants shall be featured in a prominent position making them a focal point. Over-crowding as well as large gaps shall be avoided. All plants within the display shall be accessible to enable independent viewing.

Foliage plants, such as ferns, may be used to fill gaps between the plants and to hide the pots. These plants shall enhance the display by being softly integrated within the display. Brightly coloured foliage may dominate the display and should generally be avoided as the focal point may be shifted from the orchid flowers.

Plants within the display shall be clearly labelled so the name of the plant can be read by interested people from a distance of several metres. Labels shall be unobtrusive; brightly coloured labels become a dominate feature of the display and should be avoided.

Show Rules

1. All entries are free and open to financial members of the Orchid Society of N.S.W. Inc., and its affiliated societies and others invited to exhibit by the Orchids Central Committee.
2. Entries are received upon the basis that the Orchids Central Committee, its sponsors and the venue owner, while taking all reasonable care, shall not be responsible for any loss, destruction nor damage to such exhibits and the exhibitor shall have no claim against the Orchids Central Committee, its sponsors or the venue owner.
3. All plants exhibited, or for sale, are accepted on condition that they are pest and disease free. The decision of the Show Marshal or the Show Committee shall be final.
4. Plants competing for prizes entries shall have been owned and in the possession of the exhibitor for the preceding six months. This rule does not apply to Floral Art Entries or foliage plants used in the displays.
5. The Show Marshal and/or their representative Show Committee reserves the right to reject, remove any exhibit without giving any reason for that action and to reclassify any plant, if necessary, prior to judging. Extra classes may be created at the discretion of the Show Marshal or Show Committee.
6. All plants shall be in position ready for judging by 4.00 pm on the day of judging.
7. Exhibitors may use ferns and/or foliage plants to embellish exhibits. Such plants are not considered in judging except for their decorative effect in displays. No flower or fruit other than Orchids may be used in any display.
8. Entries are eligible for judging in one class only, except seedlings and specimens.
9. Entries in Seedling, Novice, Junior and Foliage classes MUST be nominated in order to be judged and the nominations submitted to the Show Marshal by 4.00 pm on the day of judging.
10. Nominations for entries in the other classes required in the Schedule to be nominated, must be submitted to the Show Marshal by 4.00 pm on the day of judging. Please note, the Judges have discretion to award prizes to entries in these classes that are not nominated.
11. Judging shall be by a panel of Judges nominated by the O.S.N.S.W. Registrar and shall be in accordance with the rules as set out by the Show Committee and/or the standards and by-laws laid down by the O.S.N.S.W. Inc. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
12. If in the opinion of the Judges no exhibit in any class warrants a prize, none will be made.
13. Initial results are tentative until all results are collated and finalized.
14. SEEDLING' shall mean the plant grown from seed and flowered for the first time. Mericlones and plants that have been divided prior to being exhibited are not eligible as seedlings. Judging for Champions to include relevant seedlings. The Champion seedling is not to be considered for Grand Champion unless it has already won the Champion in its class.
15. Staking shall be in accordance with the rules of OSNSW. i.e. flowers may be supported in the best possible manner for presentation. This supporting should be in such a manner so as not to be obtrusive and distract from the overall beauty and charm of the plant. Single flowered genera eg *Paphiopedilum*, *Lycaste*, etc., ties or support shall be no higher than immediately below the ovary. Spikes may be tied below the first flower. Branching spikes may be staked below the last branch. Where staking does not meet the above, the judges are permitted to penalise, or temporarily remove such tie for the purpose of judging.
16. No displays are to include any water.
17. An exhibitor, including vendors, shall not remove plants, an exhibit or part thereof before the end of the show, without the prior permission of the Show Marshal or Show Committee.
18. The Show Committee reserves the right to photograph, for its own purposes, any exhibit in the show.
19. The Show Committee reserves the right to add classes and vary the rules where warranted.
20. Display representatives must be available at or near 9.30am on the Friday of the Show to assist completion of documentation of judging results.
