#### The following....are some of lan's ramblings at the birthday evening.

We need to pay tribute to the people who made OSNSW in the early days, the Ladies Auxillary, they were the lifeblood of the society fund raising, running the social activities and the suppers at the meeting. Their work and organisation of the social activities, enabled the society to operate and run the WOC in Sydney in 1969 and the Australian Orchid Conference in 1974.

They and their activities were not recorded and in the early days were the wives of the founding members of the societies. The names I remember from the 1960's and 1970's included:

Grace Mitchel, Mabs Peaty, Mavis Nichols, Ruth Woodcock, Maud Tyler who organised quarterly wine tasting.

We also has an active floral art group lead by Jean Slattery and included Mabs Peaty and Mavis Nichols.

The success over the years can be attributed to our partnership with the affiliated societies who at its height contributed with individuals and nurseries to nearly 30 displays at the Winter and spring shows, filling the Sydney Town Hall and other venues.

The Affilated Societies are an integral part of OSNSW. This continued association makes OSNSW the only remaining state orchid society existing in Australia today.

The judges are the cohesion which holds the society together, these dedicated members mostly at their own expense give up much of their time to judge our orchids and are often wrongly criticised and maligned.

Another group that needs to be mentioned are the nurseries that supported the affiliated societies and enabled them to stage the magnificent displays in the 60s and the 70s these include Wonderbah, Sunnybank, Slattery, to name a few.

Lastly the society would not function without its members who bring their plants to meeting and shows.

We need to turn our sights to the future. The centenary of OSNSW is just 10 years away and time seems to go fast, we should start now planning a spectacular celebration for 2034 worthy of our history. This should be in conjunction with the affiliates to celebrate their contribution.

Ian has plans to research and document more of our history which we hope will be ready for the BIG one! (In 2034) Past Presidents then gave a short piece on their time in Office.

Neville Anderson, President of the Woolgoolga Orchid Society and Chair of AOC Conference/Show 2025, gave a short overview of the conference plans and thanked the support of OSNSW members and was presented with a cheques for \$10,000 (including a sponsorship of \$2000). Neville spoke briefly about the conference, the venue and the local environment, urging Sydney siders to visit/register.

The Orchid Society of NSW is the last foundation member of the AOC still working as a state body, other states have folded or become local societies. That may not mean much to those present. When the AOC was formed we stood firm! thanks to Ken Siew, Ian Chalmers and Garrie Bromley not allowing the AOC to break the panel away from OSNSW. In Victoria there's two panels AOC and OSCOV. In Western Australia the panel has to raise their own funds to hold a judges meeting. In South Australia they have problems with two streams of affiliates, and the panel has split.

We have no problems like this in our state because we have avoided the politics. We have two annual shows, Orchids Out West and Orchids Central.

We've had as many as 100 judges at times. Our training by zoom across the state may mean we get up to that number again.

#### Registrar's Annual Report by Ian Chalmers

It is 50 years since I was first elected to the OSNSW Management Committee and in that time there has been a lot of changes.

The year has been a tough one with a number judges having health problems. I would express my thanks to all the judges who have worked for the society, the nominations for shows has had a much better response than in past years.

I would like to thank the people who have supported me:

John Allen who has retired from processing the Awards after about 10 years, he did a great job in crossing the I's and dotting the t's. Also Joy for taking up the challenge.

Wendy Dhu has retired from producing certificates, she has done a sterling job. Ty Tran has taken up the challenge.

Lesley Bromley has help me as judges secretary coordinator of the judging assignments and taken a weight off my shoulders

Irene Chalmers and Garrie Bromley who keep me grounded and preserve my sanity.

#### Judge Training

The Zoom Course has been a good move, while the previous two face to facecourses had a large drop off rate and resulted in few new judges there has bee few drop out from the Zoom course. It also has resulted in uniform training throughout the state. As a result all of our panels will be healthier. I will start sending out the exam papers in December. The training sessions will run continuously, and I will run the next introduction session on the 12<sup>th</sup> January. Although people can join the class at any time the best time to join is the introduction session.

#### Judges

Hardy Beilhartz, and Trish Peterson have have retired through the year. Phil Radford passed away during the year.

Judges Meeting was held in July at Long Jetty, Ian Chalmers was re-elected as Registrar. The next State Meeting will be held in Lismore early May, as long as there are no big floods in the meantime.

#### **Awards**

In the year 2023-4 there were 54 awards which is well down on the pre-Covid numbers of 90-100. This is partly due to the weather. The awards were made up as follows:

#### Cultural

- 4 x Award of Cultural Excellence
- 8 x Award of Cultural Merit
- 4 x Award of Distinction

#### **Quality Awards**

- 8 x First Class Certificates
- 28 x Awards of Merit
- 4 x Highly Commended

2024/5 is likely to be a better year with 20 awards to date.

# Nomenclature

Next year may have greater challenges with the RHS Registrar trying to redefine hybrids to include inter varietal crosses. So he will be registering crosses within in species and giving them a hybrid name. Under this all line bred orchids would be eligible to have hybrid names. We probably would accept this so would need a register of species with hybrid names.

I am going to London to argue the case of sticking with the Code. I will be supported by the American Orchid Society (AOS).

At the meeting I will be supporting the AOS in requiring evidence before registering unlikely of impossible crosses, and to stop registration of hybrids with unknown parents.

In addition, the work of Mark Clements and Katarina Nagar et al. on dendrobium (and other genera) will be published, David Jones book *A Complete Guide to Native Orchids of Australia* edition 3 looks appears to be based on this research, I believe that this is very likely to be adopted as the nomenclature for Dendrobium. This will pose some challenges for the future.

# **Election of Officers**
