# Registrar's Report

Judging class: The training course is proceeding into the practical stage for most students.

Awards: There were two awards over the past month:

I will not agree to any other AD's for this clone as it seems to be unstable. I am satisfied that the Award granted last year was to a clone that cannot be distinguished from the original and the award stands.

So far I have identified 5 plants with of this orchid with 4 of them being distinctively different enough to get a new cultivar. Have major concerns about the genetic stability of the mericlones.

There are still no volunteers for Secretary. I have started to get judges' nominations for the early shows.

#### Speaker

David Mathers Foundation and the British National Collection of Orchids. David spoke about the Foundation and how it was set up to preserve some of the orchid collections from around the UK as those who had set up these collections became unable to look after them anymore. He described some of the collections, in particular the Oncidiniiae and Pleione collections. The orchids are housed in large glass houses which have the latest technology for their heating (by biomass), cooling, misting and watering. Remarkably, the foundation only has one employee looking after some 10,000 orchids. However, the principals of the Foundation also contribute to some of the work that needs to be done. It was a very interesting presentation.
