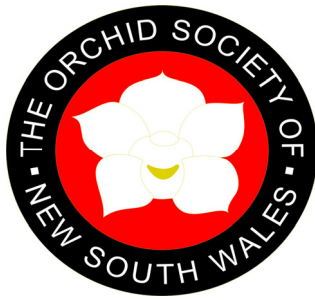

This diminutive gem of the orchid world is I think responsible for more excitement and yet more disappointment than just about any other species. Tiny plants no more than about 8cm tall, with proportionately enormous blooms bulging over the sides of the warty coriaceous leaves. The plants are a deep dull green colour and are totally upstaged by the stunning vibrant colours of the flowers, ranging from the most common red to orange, purple, pink, whites and yellows; and even bicolour types using combinations of these colours, all this in a plant that can be grown in a 5cm pot. Sounds tempting Huh!!!

Coming from Papua New Guinea, New Ireland and the oddly named Goodenough Island; 1888 is when Mueller described this species in honour of the British collector Cuthbertson who first found it in PNG, this species ranges from the northwest in Irian Jaya down the central mountain range to the southeast of PNG. They range in elevation from about 1000 metres to 3700 metres and live in a variety of habitats. Starting from the lower

elevations they tend to be terrestrial; they can be found on the edges of road cuttings growing on embankments in full sun with their roots burrowing into the clay to a depth of about 8cm, here they predominate, being devoid of any other vegetation. As you head up to higher elevations the habitat dramatically changes, travelling only a few hundred metres you start coming across thick moss covering the ground with grasses, shrubs and bushes, still you will find an abundance of our species growing in full light to shade. Heading up to the peak of their range at 3700 metres the environment changes completely again, one place at this elevation called Tari Gap is covered in a dense impenetrable moss forest and marshlands. Beech trees, ginger plants, massive tree ferns and pandanus stands all covered in moss and grasses; giving the impression that something from the Jurassic period may be lurking just out of sight in the ever present cloud layer. The drab look of this place is emphasized by the Brown Grey hues of the moisture laden plants and lichens. On the verges of these forests our plants can be found growing everywhere to a depth of about 30 metres from the forest floor to the top of the canopy, splashes of iridescent red betraying their existence, standing out like a laser light on dark wall. The plants attach themselves to the moss by entangling their roots to the outer layers of the moss that covers the trunks and branches of these forest plants.

They never get above about 25°C and as low as 5°C and like to have plenty of moisture at their roots without remaining waterlogged. Most people who have success with this orchid grow in sphagnum moss or occasionally mounted on tree fern. In the 130 odd years since this species has been known in cultivation, I have no doubt no other orchid has caused more angst or more pleasure to the orchid fraternity. This one is not for the faint hearted.

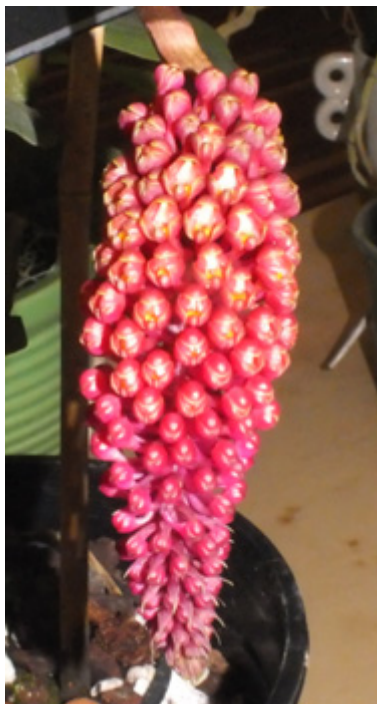

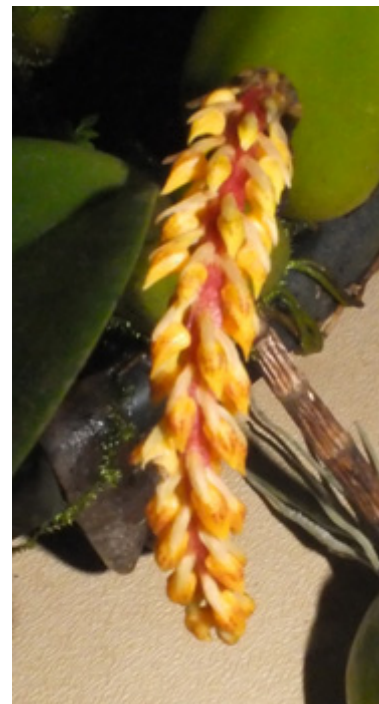
