- Ira Butler Competition: The competition for 2024/2025 has now been judged and the results will be announced shortly. - AOC Conference and Show in 2025 registrations can still be made. The AOC Conference and Show will be hosted by Woolgoolga Orchid Society, 1st to 5th October 2025. It is my pleasure to provide an update to members on the happenings of OSNSW since September 2024.

It is pleasing to note that we have attracted 12 new financial members this year. On the home front, we have resurrected our society Sales table at regular meetings under the control of Lesley Bromley and assisted by Jane D'Olier. We are off to a rather slow start, but the plants being offered for sale are all of good quality and sell quickly! We need more plants please.

We changed the pack up routine of our hall and introduced a 'special' raffle plant in compensation for the interruption of 'flow' to the meeting. We did this to enlist more assistance from members to pack away the hardware used each meeting.

The 'special' raffle plant is valued at at least \$50 and the ticket drawing causes much excitement each month.

The Royal Easter Show: Our continued involvement and member participation to the Sydney 'Royal' gives success and great pleasure to a small but dedicated group of OSNSW members. We need more participants in this endeavour, please speak to one of us for more info. Our promotional 'CART' attracts much interest from passers-by, eager for cultural advice, and the promotion of orchid society locations and meeting details for all who display interest.

Shows: Weather patterns this year have caused great consternation among our show organising committees. Our shows are targeted to the general flowering season of the genera we showcase, and to 'miss the mark' causes great disappointment all around. The big WET this year (it actually began in 2024) has created many sad stories, I suspect there will be more losses in the weeks to come.

However, our first show of the year ORCHIDS OUT WEST went off very well. (Despite the rain which had already started) the displays there showcase the fantastic local growers of the societies of the region. A very successful weekend.

The other show with OSNSW involvement is ORCHIDS CENTRAL. Held on the first weekend in October in Bankstown (so Oct 2024) the show drew many local folks from all walks of life, eager to see, learn and spend. O.C. As we call it, is still in its infancy and I expect the participation to increase markedly over the next few years.

The other major shows in the Sydney area, Mingara, the Cymbidium Extravaganza and St Ives 'The big one' all continue to flourish, all reporting increased attendances...well done to you all.

The AOC Conference and Show, hosted by the Woolgoolga and other local societies will be held from October 1^{st} to 5^{th} 2025. Set up is on October 1^{st} , judging Oct 2^{nd} and the show itself open to all from Oct 3^{rd} to 5^{th} . There is an extensive educational program to be held in the close by high school, vendors with 1000's of orchids to tempt you and the presentation dinner on Saturday Oct 4^{th} , 2025. And finally, our NEW SHOW – the SUMMER ORCHID FESTIVAL.

After we all enjoy our Christmas celebrations and pack up our societies for a well-earned break over the heat of summer, the glorious large Brazilian Cattleyas open their huge flowers to show their magnificence to but a few. We have decided to stage the Inaugural Summer Orchid Festival here at the Ermington Community Centre over the weekend of 13th and 14th December 2025. Here at the festival, we will host those wonderful cattleyas in abundance (think Cattleya purpurata, Cattleya tenebrosa and more) along with the gorgeous multi floral Paphiopedilums (another orchid which flowers in our time of recess). We already have our SOF website and FB page up and running, our schedule is now available for you to peruse and prepare your entries for this prestigious event. ALL members are invited to bring their best plants to this competition, and also those flowering plants to the sales table. You will find a link from the OSNSW website too. 
