- Tonight's special plant is C. Elizabeth Galov
- **Supper assistance for today.** Would people please volunteer to assist with the supper this evening and also help with the collection of the benching accessories? Thanks go to Antonina Forster, Lynn Dabbs and Irene Chalmers for assisting with supper, thanks also to those who contributed goodies.
- **Easter Show:** We encourage members to enter their orchids in the Royal Easter Show again this year. Members wishing to participate must register with the RAS by going to the website <https://rasnsw.com.au> exhibitor information. Orchids can be entered according to the Flower and Garden schedule and will be judged on the 6<sup>th</sup> April and again on 12<sup>th</sup> April. Entries close on 25<sup>th</sup> February. Volunteers are again required to man the Orchid Information Cart – the roster is here tonight if you would like to see what shifts are still available, please let Veronica know if you can help. You will get a free entry pass to the Show for your trouble.
- **Affiliated Societies Photo competition** 2025/26 competition is underway and photos should be sent to Ian as soon as they are available, don't wait to send them later, as you may quite easily forget to do it. Details of the Affiliated Societies Photo competition can be found in the Affiliated Societies section of our website. There are valuable cash prizes to be won for the owners of the winning orchids and also the society they belong to. The next cut-off is 30 June 2026.
- **Orchids Out West** - 15-17<sup>th</sup> May, set-up on 14<sup>th</sup> May, Hawkesbury Showground, Clarendon – Show C'tee is 'off and running', OOW is the first horticultural event this year. The Collectors Plant Fair, both at Richmond and Maitland, will not be held this year.
- **Orchids Central:** 18-20 September, Club Condell Park, 178 Eldridge St. Condell Park– First C'tee meeting 13/2/26
- **Batemans Bay Orchid and Foliage Society:** March 21-22 - South and West Regional Orchid Workshop
- **John Allen** – Open Day and Sale of Orchids, on 7<sup>th</sup> March at 19 Westbourne Drive, Bathurst
- **OSNSW Summer Orchid Festival** – An inaugural super show. Highly successful (see Chin's report), returning more than \$5,000 surplus. 150 plants were benched, hugely successful raffle, Saturday taking \$900 with tickets at \$5 each. A booking has been made for the 2026 SOF at Georges Hall Community Centre (the hall at Ermington is not available for any Sunday through November/December) from Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> December (from 6pm) to Sunday, 6 December 2026. This new venue is the same hall that is used by Bankstown OS at Georges Hall and the adjacent meeting room is included in the booking. The geographical location is 5 minutes from M5 and linked to M2 and M7. This will allow the set up to be arranged and most of plants checked in on the Friday after 6pm, with a short benching window on Saturday 7.30am to 8.00am for those who are unable to attend on Friday evening. Judging will be arranged for 8am on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> December, allowing 2 hours for judging before show opens at 10am.

### 2026 EASTER SHOW ORCHID COMPETITION!!! BE IN IT!!

Come join our team of orchid exhibitors at the annual Royal Flower and Garden Show!

The two sessions of orchid competition are: 6/7 and 12/ April.

Venue is the Flower and Garden Pavilion at Homebush.

Show Schedule for orchids includes 21 classes with 6 section champions and one Supreme Champion for each session. Prize money includes \$5 for each 1<sup>st</sup> place; \$20 per Champion; and \$100 for both Supreme Champions—plus top notch felt Champion sashes!

Orchids must be benched between 10:30 pm and 7:45 am on the 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>/13<sup>th</sup> (and collected between those same times on 8<sup>th</sup>/9<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>nd</sup>/15<sup>th</sup>.) Passes are issued to exhibitors enabling you to drive right up to the side door of the Pavilion to unload and collect your plants, no worries. All orchid exhibitors receive a free all-day pass to the Easter Show, what a bargain!

**You must register as an exhibitor by 25<sup>th</sup> February to be eligible to participate!** The cost is a mere \$39, and you can enter as many plants as you like into both sessions for this fee. You can even enter the same plants in both sessions!
