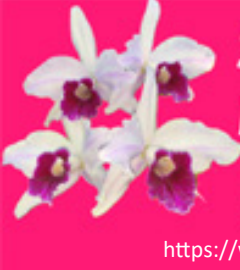

- No special plant tonight as Joe is on a well earned holiday in Malta.
- *Sales Table:* The Sales table is now in operation and the President asked members to please consider bringing their excess plants for us to sell. Sadly, there were no plants for sale tonight.
- *Affiliated Societies Photo competition:* Result to be announced next meeting! 2025/26 competition has now closed. The 2026/27 competition is now open. Details of the Affiliated Societies Photo competition can be found in the Affiliated Societies section of our website. There are valuable cash prizes to be won for the owners of the winning orchids and also for the society they belong to.

- *Orchids Out West* – Another successful show, congratulations to the organisers and volunteers. Malcolm Stone has stepped down from the position of Chairman at the completion of the 2026 OOW.....Graham Larkham is now the Chairman leading into the 2027 event.
- *Orchids Central* (18-20 September, Club Condell Park, 178 Eldridge St. Condell Park) – Preparations now well under way. Vendors are secured, volunteer recruitment underway. The Facebook page has around 1,000 followers and there is an active advertising campaign.
- *OSNSW Summer Orchid Festival* (December 4-6, Georges Hall Community Centre). Second meeting of organising committee soon, event in recess. As this is an OSNSW show, there will be no vendors but members are invited to bring in orchids to sell.
- Coming up is the National Cymbidium Extravaganza 7-9 August at Yagoona (including the Annual Paphiopedilum Show). This is followed by St Ives Orchid Fair from 14-16 August.
- *AOC News* – Peter D'Olier reported on AOC meeting held on 11 July 2026: there will be changes made to the Constitution; there is a new website that is now active; there is now a quarterly newsletter which is sent to every club secretary for distribution to members. Among the orchid advice it offers, there is a listing of all the upcoming orchid shows Australia-wide; the AOC magazine, Orchid Australia, will now be sent out quarterly from beginning of 2027 and it is hoped to have this available online in due course. Tonight's Speaker

This was Greg Griffis, Curator of the Eric Young Foundation which has just celebrated its 40th anniversary. The founder was a successful businessman, Eric Young, who dedicated his efforts to the cultivation, display, and scientific hybridisation of a world-class orchid collection. It is now administered by a Trust. The Foundation has its home on the island of Jersey where it has a large display house plus 8 large greenhouses. It takes displays on a regular basis to the Chelsea Flower Show where it is a winner of awards each year. Greg took us through some of the orchids such as the Vuylstekeara that the Foundation specialises in, giving us information on how to grow these hybrids. *Odontoglossums*, *Paphiopedilums* and *Phragmipediums* were also highlighted.

It is pleasing to note that we have attracted 12 new financial members this year. On the home front, we have resurrected our society Sales table at regular meetings under the control of Lesley Bromley and assisted by Jane D'Olier. We are off to a rather slow start, but the plants being offered for sale are all of good quality and sell quickly! We need more plants please.

We changed the pack up routine of our hall and introduced a 'special' raffle plant in compensation for the interruption of 'flow' to the meeting. We did this to enlist more assistance from members to pack away the hardware used each meeting.

The 'special' raffle plant is valued at at least \$50 and the ticket drawing causes much excitement each month.

The Royal Easter Show: Our continued involvement and member participation to the Sydney 'Royal' gives success and great pleasure to a small but dedicated group of OSNSW members. The other show with OSNSW involvement is ORCHIDS CENTRAL. Held on the first weekend in October in Bankstown (so Oct 2024) the show drew many local folks from all walks of life, eager to see, learn and spend. O.C. As we call it, is still in its infancy and I expect the participation to increase markedly over the next few years.

CATASETUM

From the Greek kata, meaning down, and the Latin seta, meaning bristle, referring to the pair of trigger antennae in the staminate flowers.

A genus of about 100 species distributed throughout the Neotropics from Mexico to Bolivia. The genera *Clowesia* and *Dressleria* were previously included in a more broadly defined *Catasetum*. *Catasetum* is divided into two subgenera, subg. *Catasetum* and subg.

Catasetums are cyclic and notoriously heavy feeders during active growth. Not particular about their growing medium, place them in pots or baskets in very bright light. Give them abundant water and frequent dilute fertilizer after the new shoots have emerged and the roots have grown to more than 1 in. (2.5 cm). Premature fertilizing can burn young root tips. Some growers supplement standard liquid fertilizer with additional time-release fertilizer and organics (fish emulsion, manure, etc.). After growth and flowering

have ceased withhold all water and fertilizer until the next season. Many growers remove the plants from the pots during dormancy and store the pseudobulbs in a drier environment removed from wet greenhouse conditions, repotting them when new growth emerges. When plants of *Catasetum* are grown in high light, the inflorescences typically bear horticulturally less desirable pistillate ("female") flowers. When grown under low light, the inflorescences typically bear staminate ("male") flowers but on relatively weak plants. The best of both worlds can be achieved by growing the plants under high light for maximum photosynthesis and "tricking" the plant into producing staminate flowers by placing a 1 in. (2.5 cm) long, loose-fitting, opaque cap on the emerging inflorescence. This cap will induce the hormonal shift necessary to produce the more desirable staminate flowers. Staminate flowers of *Catasetum* have an active pollination mechanism. The stipe of the pollinarium is produced early in the development of the column. As

the column continues to

grow in the bud the stipe is stretched much as one stretches a rubberband. Projecting downward from the column are two long antennae-like triggers. When these triggers are touched the pollinarium springs away from the flower with great force. The viscidium of *Catasetum* bears copious instant-drying glue that attached the pollinarium to whatever triggered the flower. Dislodging the pollinarium causes post-pollination senescence of the flower, most often a reddening of the flower. Because of the often dimorphic flowers and general similarity of the pistillate flowers, the key and the species descriptions refer only to staminate flowers.
